There is no doubt about it, the 2009 season IS STILL "underway...making way". Seneca Lake and the





### Seneca Sail & Power Squadron Announces Fall Class Schedule

### It's Back To School Time!

It's paper, pencils, books, binders, calculators and computers. Yes, it's that time of year when everyone traditionally heads back to school and we start (reluctantly) thinking about preparing for the off-season when it comes to boating. Fortunately for USPS members, we don't have to stop thinking about boating through the long months between boating seasons.

After a busy season on the water, the Seneca Education Department is pleased to be able to offer the "Weather" elective as our fall course. This is a course that consistently receives high marks in its quality and content and it is an excellent course to help you get in tune with the world around you. From the national USPS web site, the course is described as follows:

"The safety and comfort of those who venture out-on-the water have always been weather dependent. In this course students will become keener observers of the weather, but weather observations only have meaning in the context of the basic principles of meteorology — the science of the atmosphere.

The course focuses on how weather systems form, behave, move, and interact with one another and reflects the availability of all sorts of weather reports and forecasts on the Internet. Wx2008 is a general weather course benefiting those sitting in their living rooms, as much as those standing behind the helm."

Your instructors for the course will be two gentlemen with great experience with this subject. Don Kloeber has been teaching this course for many years and has a reputation for making the material easy to understand. Tom Taylor has years of practical experience in dealing with weather through is role as a pilot and can tell you first-hand how the conditions "up there" can be significant for a boater "down here."

### NY requires life jackets for cold weather boating

ALBANY -- New York has become the first state to require life jackets for everyone in all small pleasure craft during the six coldest months of the year, when capsized boaters drown faster in chilly water.

Starting Nov. 1, kayakers, canoeists and all those aboard motorboats under 21 feet must wear Coast Guard-approved personal flotation devices while on lakes, the ocean or other waterways.

The rule remains in effect through May 1. Violators will face fines ranging from \$100 to \$250.

Similar measures apply to canoes and kayaks in Massachusetts and to all manually propelled vessels, including rowboats, in Connecticut.

Falling into cold water can trigger shock, disorientation or gasping and inhaling water. Immersion can lead to hypothermia and passing out.

### Squadron Performs FREE Vessel Safety Checks





On Saturday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, Seneca Squadron Vessel Safety Examiners held a Vessel Safety Check Day at the Village Marina. Eight Boats were successfully checked and passed. The free Vessel Safety Check Program helps to achieve voluntary compliance with state recreational boating safety laws, particularly with regard to the carriage of safety equipment. It also helps raise awareness about safety and environmental issues through voluntary contact by a Vessel Examiner. A Vessel Safety Check is not a boarding or a law enforcement issue. No citations are given. It is for safety awareness only and given as a public service. Participants are provided with a copy of the examiner's checklist and encouraged to follow suggestions given. Upon successful completion of the VCS participants are awarded a VSC decal to display. This does not exempt you from law enforcement boarding, but with a vessel safety check decal and the proper safety equipment you can be prepared to make it a positive encounter.

A major component of a fun filled outing is a boat which has all the necessary equipment operating properly. A free vessel safety check is the answer and our members will be happy to perform the check. If you would like to have your boat inspected contact Cdr. Terry Stewart, give him you dock location and when you would like it checked. He will make arrangements to have this done for you.
